First aiders to be present at all times, youth leaders to be first aid qualified.	If hot weather personnel should be appropriately dressed with suitable headgear.
Cold weather - hypothermia	Anyone in the parade	All personnel to be suitably dressed for the weather. Section commanders & first aiders to be fully aware of symptoms of hypothermia, especially in young and old participants. Anyone	

		suspected of suffering from hypothermia to be handed over to first aiders.	
Parade marching on public roads	Anyone in the parade	Guernsey Police to be fully briefed on the route the parade will take with relevant timings. Front & rear escorts to wear high visibility clothing, escort vehicles to be clearly identified as such.	Additional personnel maybe required to control vehicular access onto the parade route.
Distance of parade march	Anyone in the parade	Participants to be made aware of the distance to be marched and the approximate time it should take. Participants to be briefed that they can fall out from the parade at any time should they find it too strenuous.	Small/young people may struggle so Youth Groups to have support staff alongside the parade during the march to look after any children who might fall out.
Traffic, road crossing and vehicles collecting parade participants.	All personnel departing the final venue.	Personnel to use recognised crossing control points where available; vehicular access to be controlled where appropriate; small children to be handed over to parents by relevant youth leaders.
