1. Introduction

The Royal Guernsey Light Infantry departed Guernsey on 1st June 1917 for active service in France during the First World War. To mark this hundredth anniversary the charitable trust, a number of private agencies and government bodies are working together to produce a series of commemorative and celebratory events. This document provides context as a time line for all the activities and participants and is designed to inform the stakeholders and place detailed activities in context. It is an iterative document with version control. Participants will be dressed in Uniform, Court Dress or Lounge suits with medals and decorations.

2. Tuesday 28th November 2017

16:00 Desktop Briefing

A desktop briefing will take place at the Mairie for representatives of all the invited French participants in the parade and commemoration, presenting the opportunity to meet the organising team, receive a copy of the itinerary and understand the order of the service. This will be hosted by CO & JM.

14:00 Mairie, Masnieres

Assemble at the Mairie in Masnieres, greeting by M. Francis Noblecourt, following which there will be a briefing of the following days memorial events including a walk to Les Rue Vertes and demonstration of the positions for the commemoration. This will be given by Chris Oliver & Colin Vaudin.

15:00 Mairie, Masnieres.

There will then be a conducted walking tour of Masnieres and Les Rue Vertes site and new memorial hosted by Chris Oliver & Jean-Marie Labre. The purpose of this is to understand the history of the battle.


4. Thursday 30th November 2017

09:00 Masnieres World War One Memorial

Assemble at Mairie then by walk to the Masnieres World War One memorial and the informal and private placement of a wreath by His Excellency Sir Ian Corder and Bailiff Sir Richard Collas on behalf of Guernsey. Playing of the last post by PWRR bugler followed by a two-minute silence. Playing of call to arms by PWRR Bugler and dismissal. The party will return to the Mairie where coffee will be available.

09:30 RGLI Commemorative Parade Assembly

Assembly of the parade elements at the main car park opposite the Mairie. The Parade Commander and Two Parade Sgt Major's will have marked out forming up area.



Elements of the parade and order of march as follows:


- Parade Commander Lt Col (Retd) CM Vaudin

- British Army Princess of Wales Royal Regiment (12 men / Bugler) Col W Harber.
- Official Party The Bailiff, Prefet, Sous-Prefet, Mairie, Guernsey Politicians & Civil Servants. (His Excellency and principal French dignitary will be driven by vehicle)
- Parade Sgt Major
- Veterans Flag Parties (French Veterans and Royal British Legions Guernsey & Sark)
- Veterans (French and British/ Guernsey)
- EPIDE Cadets
- Guernsey Army Cadet Force

10:15 RGLI Commemorative Parade Departure

The National Gendarmerie will close the main roads during the whole of the parade. The parade will move off in line of order under the instruction of the parade commander and sgt major's, proceeding over the bridge and turning right into Les Rue Vertes.

10:30 RGLI Parade Arrival

On the arrival of the parade at Les Rue Vertes the parade commander will halt the parade and the two parade Sgt Major's will disperse the groups into positions shown below.



10:45 Departure of Principal Dignitaries

The principle dignatories will depart from the Mairie by vehicle to Les Rues Vertes (via the Ruette du Moulin), dismount and be escorted to their positions, which are under cover, by the parade commander.

11:00 Drum Head Order of Service

Conducted by the Very Rev, Dean of Guernsey & Abbe Henri Braq. Orders of service will be provided by the town of Masnieres in French for all participants.

- The Welcome by The Very Reverend Dean of Guernsey, Tim Barker and Abbe Henri Braq
- First Hymn [to be advised] to be played by French Band
- The Bidding Prayer
- Address by His Excellency Vice Admiral Sir Ian Corder KBE
- Response from the principal French dignitary
- The Dedication of the Memorial
- Laying of Wreaths with assistance from Guernsey & EPIDE cadets
- Last Post and Two Minute Silence followed by Call to Arms
- Second Hymn to be played by French Band
- The final prayers, commendation and blessing
- Band plays 'God Save The Queen' followed by 'The Marseillaise'

There then follows and inspection of the parade by the following dignitaries, during which time the choir will sing.

11:45 Departure of Parade

Reformation of the parade by the parade commander and the march off to return to car park, this is a reverse route. Order given for dismissal.

Vin d'Honneur hosted by the French authorities at the Salle M. Verin for all participants of the parade and the local commune. Speech by FN and response by The Bailiff, Sir Richard Collas

13:00 Event Ends
